

# A virtual exploration of Lascaux Cave

## Information for using the Oculus VR

Thanks to **Oculus technology**, you can take an amazing journey into the Lascaux Cave, enjoying the same sensations experienced by those who originally discovered this archaeological site.

You will **explore** the cave by torchlight and **interact** with its walls, copying the gestures of prehistoric men and women. Watch surprised as your creation come alive and the animals move in the flickering glow of the oil lamps and torches brought by the artists.

### Practical information

- The VR visors are easy to put and are disinfected after each use
- There is no need to remove glasses or contact lenses
- The experience can be enjoyed either standing or sitting
- Your hands appear in the virtual world, allowing you to interact with the cave walls
- A narrator, the spirit of Lascaux, gives a detailed explanation of what you need to know about the cave

### Who is allowed to use the visor and how it works

**You must be 13 years of age to use the VR (Oculus) visor.** Children under the age of 13 are not allowed to use the VR visor unsupervised. Use by children aged 8 to 12 is at the discretion of the accompanying adult, who must supervise the child at all times.

These **age limits** are due to the weight and size of the visor. Of an unsuitable size, it is not designed for children and may cause them to feel unwell, with prolonged use affecting their health.

The Lascaux VR experience lasts **about 15 minutes** and contains no strong images or flashing lights. It may however cause **headaches and nausea** in more sensitive subjects.

The experience moves at a slow pace, accompanied by a reassuring voice and contains no unexpected occurrences. In children aged 8 to 12, the semi-darkness and the sensation of being alone may cause **fear or slight anxiety**.

**Children under the age of 18 cannot be left alone** while the accompanying adult uses the VR visor.
